

# Thanks for your support over 24 years

When I was first elected to Council, I never dreamt I would either be on it for so long, or be involved in so many, varied, public activities.

I've been asked a lot recently what I enjoyed the most on Council - my reply has been 'certainly not the meetings, but what I got the most satisfaction out of were the community activities in the West area and, more recently, the campaigning for better transport throughout the city and region.'

Some of the community highlights were; working on the Western Community News for 17 or so years, helping get the Western

and Pukete Community Centres built and running, campaigning against water meters, running the social volleyball competitions in Te Rapa for most of the time, helping sort out residents' issues with Council and other bureaucracies, woking on getting the Living Wage for Council workers and for our underpaid bus drivers, coaching kids' volleyball teams at Fraser High, and working on Hamilton's growth-related issues (we're the fastest-growing city in the country, over the last 10 years).

After not too many years on Council, I realised what a crucial role transport plays in the life of Hamiltonians, and worked on many transport campaigns and issues

- starting with the installation of 40kph speed limits outside every school in the city (the first in the country) and other road safety measures; dramatically improving the city's bus services - including getting the Orbiter started, starting the move for more and safer cycleways, getting the Ring Road finished, and of course who could forget our Te Huia rail service to Auckland, successfully growing each month.

My best wishes to the West Hamilton communities for the years ahead.



### **Kai and Carols at Good News Community**



I have also led a strong team of volunteers to help with 6 neighbourhood cleanups, 4 tree plantings and 6 blood donation drives.


